Nice job, Michelle! Now hang onto this copy of Point of ORIGIN 'til raise time.


...But I Know What I Like.

HEADS-UP ON HOLIDAYS

Here are the official business closing dates for ORIGIN during the upcoming holiday periods so that employees can plan ahead. Hopefully, most of us can take advantage of this well-deserved time off. However, some folks may still have to work during some of this time to finish products, prepare for January CES, etc. Those cases will be handled on a department-by-department basis and hopefully, some alternate arrangements can be made for people "caught in the crunch."

Thanksgiving: Thursday & Friday, November 28-29 (2 holiday days)

Christmas Week: Monday through Friday, December 23-27 (3 holiday days, 2 mandatory vacation days)

(Note: We traditionally close for one entire week at Christmas. This

year, because Christmas Day falls on a Wednesday, three of those days will be company-paid holidays: the 23rd, 24th and 25th. The remaining two days are the company-controlled vacation days — two of the twelve days each employee gets each year. So please make sure you "save" two of your current vacation days for this purpose — it can be the vacation day you accrue on October 31 and November 30— otherwise, it is treated as unpaid time off. Only employees who join us in October thru December can be "advanced" the needed one or two days for immediate "repayment" as the days are earned in the first two months of employment.)

New Year's: Wednesday, January 1st (1 holiday day).

401(k) PLAN UPDATE

Individual 401(k) accounts have now been established through QUADS for all participating employees. Unfortunately, we did not do a thorough enough job obtaining all essential data on each participant (i.e.: addresses, phone numbers, etc.), so a bit more paperwork is required on most folks in order to get fully rolling.

If you still have the set of QUADS forms that were distributed with Robert Garriott's September 5th memo regarding 401(k) investment options, that's what we need completed ASAP. This applies to all Plan participants, even if you intend to leave all of your funds in the FDIC-insured money market account.

The three forms to complete are:

- "Section 401(k) Plan Joinder
 Agreement" (2 pages)
- "Client Statement Of

Acknowledgement & Release"

• "Mutual Fund Asset Transfer And

Client Acknowledgement"

Instructions were provided with the forms. If you have any questions, or need another set of these forms, please see Mark or Ron in Finance, or ask me (Fred Schmidt).

If you intend to leave your funds in the money market account, you must indicate this under "Standing Instructions" in the "Investment Designation" section of the Joinder Agreement by writing: "FDIC-insured money market account at a QUADS-determined bank," unless you wish to specify a particular bank or other type of account or elect to move into any of the many other investment options offered through the QUADS system.

New employees are all eligible to participate in the 401(k) Savings Plan after 90 days of employment. Remember: this is one of the finest ways you can possibly save money for your future! Not only is it taxdeferred until you withdraw it, and gaining healthy returns through your investment elections, but ORIGIN will also be matching your contributions each year! This fiscal year, the company expects to match your salary deferrals by 25% to 50% up to a total of 6% of your salary amount. MOVIN' UP THE HILL

The migration of the Publishing Group has finally begun as ORIGIN makes room for an expanding Product Development Group. The transition to 206 Wild Basin Road will continue over the next two weeks as delays in phone lines and network in-

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stallation at the new location slow progress.

ORIGIN now has three suites in the building next door. The miniwarehouse will continue operating out of its present location at Suite 107. Down the hall, Suite 106 will house the entire Marketing Department, as well as about a dozen Product Development personnel (either the Nintendo or FM-Towns group). Up one floor, in Suite 207, you can find Customer Service, Operations, Sales, Finance, and Robert and Fred. The new digs are still going to be tight with a projected 41 people located there when all is said and done.

Additionally, back here at 110 W.B., we plan to convert ORIGIN's current main-entrance lobby into additional office space in early November, thus maxing out every square inch of our available office space. Granted, it's not an ideal situation being crammed together and spread across five suites in two buildings. But we're all such good pals, no doubt we'll muddle through this period just fine until we can reconsolidate the whole company again in about a year in more suitable quarters. Hang in there!

In answer to the most-asked questions:

- For the external world, there will be NO CHANGE in any of the basic company-contact information. The main 5490 phone number and 3825 fax number will remain the same, as will our mailing address. So no new business cards or letterhead will be required. Those phones will be answered over in the 206 W.B. building, where Reception will be based.
- Product Development will be getting a new, unlisted, main telephone number which will connect callers with the present automated answering system. Norma Vargas, who is tak-

ing over the duties of Michelle Caddell, will answer and direct any calls that are not self-directed to specific extentions. Norma will also greet and sign-in visitors to Product Development. The new "main entrance" for the whole of the P.D. department will be the door nearest to Jeff Wilson's office on the lower floor.

- Customer Service and 800 Sales lines remain the same.
- ORIGIN is seeking an improved travel path between the two buildings. Unless a staircase of some kind can be installed next to the wall, we ask all employees and their guests to please walk AROUND the stone wall. It's only a few extra paces. Climbing that wall is very dangerous and we don't want to see anyone getting injured. Again, for the hard-of-reading: DON'T CLIMB THE WALL!
